		The organization and control is assigned to the
		obstetrician-gynecologist (head of the maternity
		welfare center). An obstetrician-gynecologist, a

midwife and a psychologist are engaged in educational activities.

In accordance with the subject of the classes, the following medical specialists may participate in the training process: pediatrician, exercise therapy instructor, endocrinologist, etc. When choosing the format of the lesson (popular lecture, lecture-dialogue, game, training), the age and level of preparation of the participants are taken into account. Classes are structured on a "simple-to-complex" basis.

The most suitable form of classes is evening classes, 3-4 times a month. The optimal number of participants in a group is 6-12 people.

The target group to be trained is pregnant women who are under dispensary observation for pregnancy at the institution's maternity welfare center.

Patients are referred to the School by their attending physician or local midwife.

Upon completion of the curriculum, final classes are held in the form of interviews with participants on the main issues of the material covered.

For effective training, visualization and visual propaganda, it is necessary to purchase the following equipment and materials:

- interactive board;
- information resources (diaries, memos, brochures, posters);
- computer, audio/video equipment;
- baby changing table, doll (baby), fake breast model for baby feeding, swaddling accessories.

The protection of motherhood and childhood is the most important priority of the state social policy.

The birth of a child is an important event for every person and a new stage in the life of a family.

		During pregnancy, a woman, in addition to the joy of expecting a child, has many questions and fears that greatly affect her physiological and emotional state. Therefore, expectant mothers need to receive information from professionals in an accessible and correct form. Classes at the School are aimed at developing a positive attitude towards methorhood.
		positive attitude towards motherhood, a thoughtful and conscious attitude towards one's condition, women's awareness of the joy of motherhood, and the formation and strengthening of an emotional connection between mother and child. Communication with like-minded people during the learning process is of great importance as it gives the opportunity to recharge with positive emotions.
